WATER RESTRICTIONS IN EFFECT YEAR-ROUND per the Fraser Municipal Code:

- Outside watering and irrigation is strictly prohibited between the hours of 9 AM and 5 PM. Hand-held watering by hose and watering canister during this time is allowed; but is not encouraged.
- Timers are strongly recommended on all irrigation systems and hoses, with a time setting not to exceed 30 minutes per rotation. Rain sensors on such systems are also recommended.
- Washing cars, boats, campers, windows, and the like, shall be done only when the hose is equipped with a flow restricting device such as a trigger nozzle (an example is shown above at right).



NOXIOUS WEEDS to be TREATED BY TOWN GARDNER

Town Gardener Cathleen Brown (cbrown@town.fraser.co.us or 970-726-5491 x230) is a licensed herbicide applicator and qualified supervisor trained in the proper use and application of the chemicals to treat noxious weeds throughout Town. The application targets only noxious weeds and is not applied to private property. Applicators follow product label guidelines regarding the rate of application, wind and moisture conditions. Please avoid direct contact with plants when the chemical is freshly applied. The work will occur through the summer months during favorable conditions.

TOWN SEEKS BETTER COMMUNICATION WITH CITIZENS

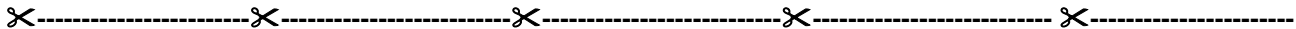
