



PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS UPDATE

The contractor for the CR 72 Realignment project has been delayed due to unusually high ground water. Expected completion date for this project is fall 2019.

The Hwy 40 Pedestrian Safety Improvements project is nearing completion. Thank you for your patience during the work. The Town will accomplish the task of planting in the medians and in planting areas alongside the roadway in 2019 and 2020.

The County Road 8 Bridge over the Fraser River Project is scheduled to begin on August 1. This project will necessitate detours during the bridge replacement. The bridge project is anticipated to be completed by early winter, weather permitting, but could extend into spring of 2020. Please proceed at or below posted speeds as you make your way through the detours.



UTILITY CUSTOMERS TAKE NOTE – RATE CHANGE EFFECTIVE APRIL 1 REFLECTED IN THIS QUARTERLY BILLING INVOICE

At its February 6, 2019 meeting, the Board of Trustees made adjustments to the water service fee schedule to encourage water conservation by high consumption residential users. The rates are effective April 1 and are reflected in the June 30 second-quarter utility billing (included in this mailing).

Water and Wastewater Base Rates remain the same at \$153.00 and \$137.50, respectively, per quarter per Single Family Equivalent as billed quarterly. Changes in water consumption rates are in bold, below.

Water Consumption Rates for commercial properties remain as before with Tiers 1, 2 and 3 at \$1.50 per 1,000 gallons.

Water Consumption Rates for residential use properties are:

- Tier 1 - \$1.50 per 1,000 gallons for 0 to 12,000 gallons**
- Tier 2 - \$3.00 per 1,000 gallons for 12,001 to 20,000 gallons**
- Tier 3 - \$6.00 per 1,000 gallons for 20,001 gallons and over**

Other fees not associated with usual water service remain unchanged (Bulk Water Permits, declined credit card and insufficient-fund check fees, penalties for tampering with water meters, etc.).

WATER RESTRICTIONS IN EFFECT YEAR-ROUND per the Fraser Municipal Code:



- Outside watering and irrigation are prohibited between the hours of 9 AM and 5 PM. Hand-held watering by hose and watering canister during this time is allowed; but is not encouraged.

- Timers are strongly recommended on all irrigation systems and hoses, with a time setting not to exceed 30 minutes

per rotation. Rain sensors on such systems are also recommended.

- Washing cars, boats, campers, windows, and the like, shall be done only when the hose is equipped with a flow restricting device such as a trigger nozzle (an example is shown in the photo above).
